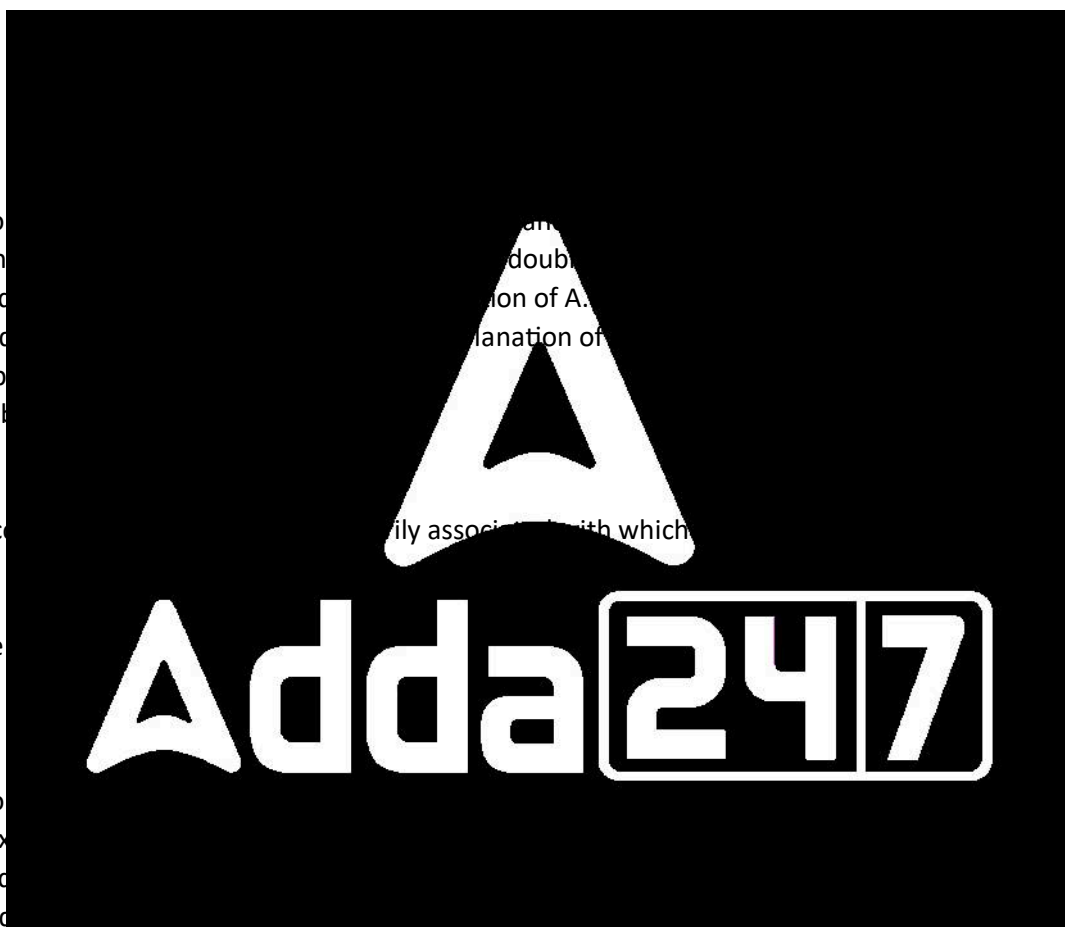

gain traction before verification mechanisms can intervene. Algorithmic curation, designed to maximize user engagement, frequently amplifies polarizing content and entrenches ideological echo chambers. Coordinated misinformation campaigns, bot-driven amplification, and digitally orchestrated harassment have, in several instances, compromised public trust in electoral processes and institutional legitimacy. Consequently, while digital platforms expand expressive freedoms, they simultaneously expose democratic systems to novel forms of destabilization.

The democratic ramifications of digital media, therefore, hinge not merely on technological innovation but on regulatory foresight and civic responsibility. Robust content moderation policies, enhanced digital literacy, and transparent algorithmic governance are indispensable if societies are to reconcile openness with accountability. Digital platforms, in themselves, are neither guarantors of democratic vitality nor harbingers of its decline; their ultimate impact will be determined by the norms, safeguards, and ethical commitments that shape their use.
